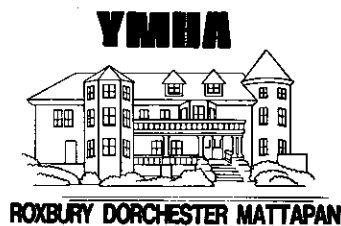

I was reminded of this repeatedly when I began to call some of the guys from the old neighborhood, some of whom I hadn't seen in close to thirty years. Without exception they were cordial to me, saddened by Billy's death, and eager to share memories of Billy . . . because Billy's outgoing personality and fun loving nature had put him ("Rocky" to many) in the public domain, like a local politician.

At the service those who had shared Billy's friendship and each other's hugged and shed tears and remembered. It was ironic and yet fitting that Billy had brought all of us together yet one more time, because that's what he was all about. Whether for a party in the old days or as a founding board member of this alumni association, Billy always wanted to keep dear friends together.

Maybe it would be a fitting tribute to Billy to call that buddy you've been meaning to contact, perhaps make a donation in his name to the Heart Fund, or to make every effort to attend the Y.M.H.A. Alumni Reunion in 1990. He really loved his friends and nothing would have made him happier. Billy always had great instincts and, somehow, I think he'll know.
